As a barrier island, Ocean City is abundant with wildlife. Most of the time the wildlife is unseen but it is always present. Sometimes you just need to be patient, aware of your surroundings and quiet.

Sea Life

You merely have to walk the water's edge to see the life the ocean supports. Atlantic dolphins migrate and play just off the beach. Crabs nibble at your toes and seabirds chatter overhead.

Wildlife


Enjoy both the busy spots for active adventures and the quiet spots for watching an osprey family resting on their nest or a sunset on the bay.
